Hospital notary totes seal and a smile

Got a will? Need a smile? Or maybe you just want to jump on a trampoline.

Whatever your reason for seeing Barbara Hoyt, division secretary and notary public at Bay Medical Center's business office, chances are her spirit's willing, even if the body's not.

Like the time her grandsons invited their trim, 53-year-old grandmother to go skateboarding. Already well versed in trampolines and go-carts through them, Hoyt said she had to draw the line.

"I'm afraid my bones are a bit too fragile for that," Hoyt laughs.

But it's Hoyt's outgoing nature which benefits others, including patients and employees at Bay Medical, where she was named the hospital-wide Employee of the Year in 1989.

"If there is a need of any kind, she is always ready to help," said hospital volunteer Sandy Sanderson, who helps Hoyt in the business office. "She's just a super person."

WHIRLWIND

Born in Newnan, Ga., Hoyt moved to Panama City in 1974. Here she married second husband Harley Hoyt, a navigation training instructor, in 1979 after a "whirlwind romance."

"He's quite the opposite in many ways. He's intelligent, reserved, patient and very, very supportive," Hoyt said. "I share with everybody. It's my nature."

Backed by her husband, Hoyt said she immersed herself in a variety of activities. Now her job has evolved beyond the usual secretarial duties.

In addition to notary work, Hoyt currently handles most of the office's legal paperwork and compiles monthly reports on the status of hospital charity cases. Usually this means working directly with patients.

"I love dealing with the people — that's the best part," said Hoyt, a self-described "people person."

"The patients and people I work with at Bay Medical are just so wonderful. I call them my medical center family."

As a notary, Hoyt said she visits patients and relatives on request, helping them with last wills or witnessing birth certificates. Given the high costs of hospitals in

general, Hoyt say many patients lately are requesting help with "living wills" outlining the signee's final wishes regarding medical care. Requests grew so numerous that she finally drafted a hospital copy based on federal guidelines. Although not tested by a lawyer, people still request it.

"This one is designed with a spiritual nature," Hoyt said, adding: "It's weird, people will call me about it that aren't even in the hospital. They've heard through a friend of a friend."

Working with patients helps her to empathize others, Hoyt said. In fact, her job has helped her cope with the death of her own father, Willard Morris, five years ago. The only girl out of seven children, Hoyt said she had an especially close relationship with her parents.

"I was only three pounds when

born. He (her father) called me his "miracle baby," she said. When Morris was hospitalized with congestive heart failure in 1986, she was devastated.

"If I had not been working at the hospital, I'm not sure how easily I'd been able to deal with it," she said. "It sounds strange, but I've learned to see the beauty in it ... Death is a part of God's process."

Now she has three children, Tony, Debbie, Kim and Kellie, and eight grandchildren. Remaining "children" include two pampered cats, Koko and Kiwi.

Besides her full-time job at the hospital, Hoyt's hobbies include singing at weddings and in her church choir at Gulf View United Methodist Church. She's even made home tapes at the request of friends, taping in her own "music room" at her Hilland Park residence.

And on weekends, chances are you'll find her teaching the young adult Sunday school class at Gulf

View United Methodist or visiting with the numerous friends she has made through work, including 93-year-old Herschel Labbrook, a former patient. Every Sunday, Hoyt and her mother, Effie Morris, take Labbrook to church, then out for lunch and a yogurt.

"He's become very important in my life," she said fondly.

People have noticed this willingness to help.

"I thought, 'Gee, they didn't know me that well,'" Hoyt said, recalling being named Employee of the Year for 1989 at the hospital. "I was so honored — I was overwhelmed."

"But you know, it is the little things you do in life that people notice. They really do."

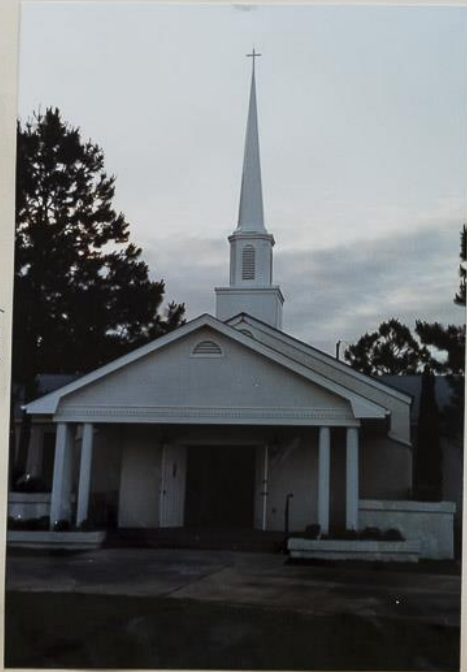

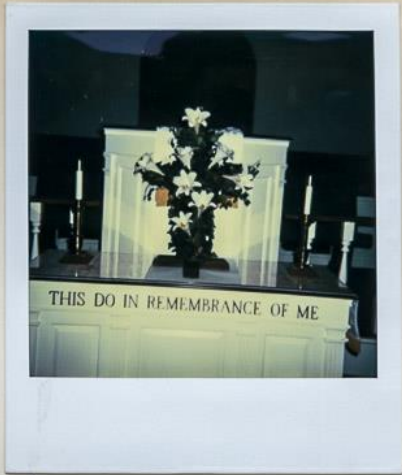

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following was included in a recent newsletter from Lakewood UMC in Huntsville. Mr. Leach is slated to leave the Lakewood pastorate June 5 to join the ministerial staff of Birmingham Vestavia Hills UMC.

Many have been asking, "Who is coming to Lakewood to be the new pastor?" I have received several phone calls from other clergy (including a Lutheran) asking the same question.

The answer is, "We don't know yet." In an age of instant coffee, microwaved meals, and a fax-it-to-me-now society, it is sometimes difficult to wait. (I believe the Psalmists dealt with this issue, too.)

Appointments are always tentative. Some years they are more tentative than others. I remember a few years ago a friend was fetched from his seat at annual conference to be told that he and several other pastors were being moved at the last minute.

The process of deploying clergy is difficult and sensitive. Lakewood's Staff Parish Relations Committee acts as our liaison with the district superintendent in an advisory capacity.

The SPRC is requesting someone who is young in heart. They have wisely realized this is more a matter of temperament and attitude rather than the number of laps one has made around the

sun. I heard NBC's John Chancellor say recently that Gen. Colin Powell would be a good candidate for the presidency in 1966. He said General Powell would be 59 — the perfect age. Yet friend told me this week the bishop explained the difficulty they were having in placing him by saying, "Many churches aren't receiving pastors in their sixties."

One may be perfect to lead the nation but too old to lead a congregation! It is important that I stay out of the mating dance between the SPRC and the superintendents. But I do have a suggestion for the perfect pastor for Lakewood (or any other church). He is Si Mathison.

It may be hard to get him because he's in his eleventh year at Gulfview UMC in Panama City, Fla. This young pastor has led Gulfview to significant growth.

Si also serves as an afternoon chaplain at a local hospital. He leads a weekly Bible study for two different businesses. He has a radio program. He is an avid tennis player. His vitality and his ministry are the envy of many of his peers.

Si works cheap. His salary (according to the 1990 Alabama-West Florida Journal) is just \$17,800. He's a good preacher, with experience, and he is an effective pastor.

How old is Si, you ask? Eighty-one.

Afterward, guests moved to the beautiful sanctuary for a



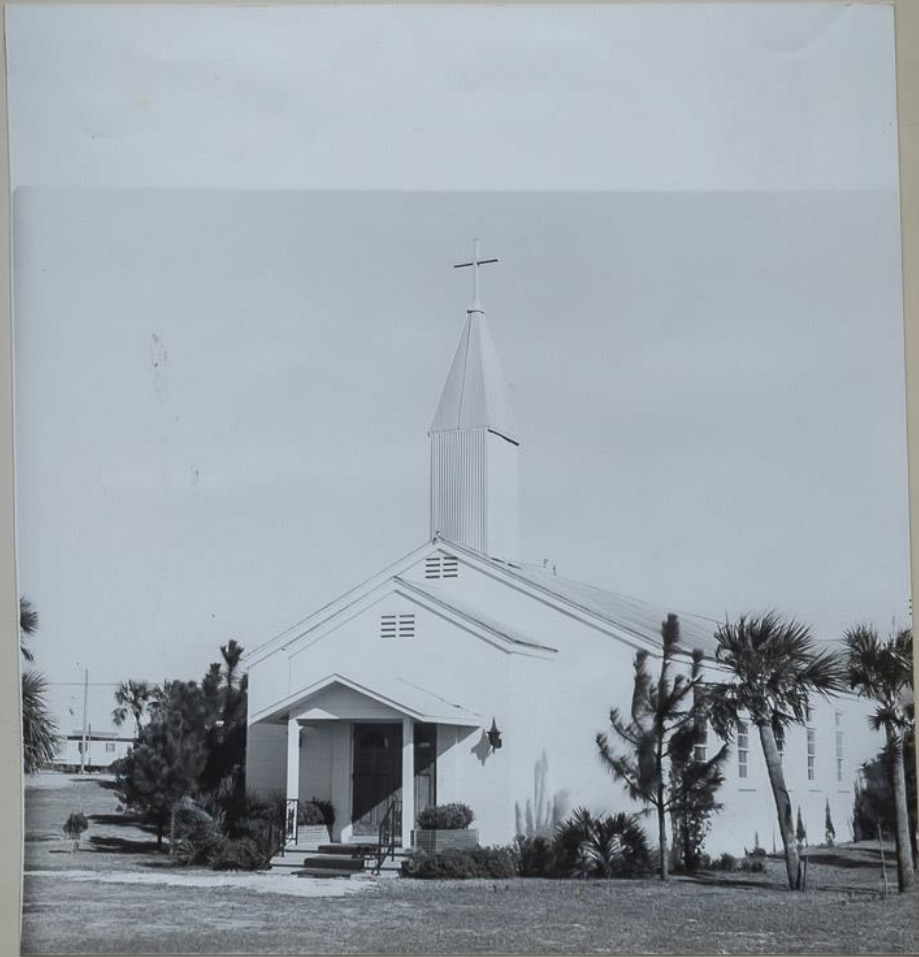
Dr. Si Mathison and wife Mary are surprised by son at birthday party.

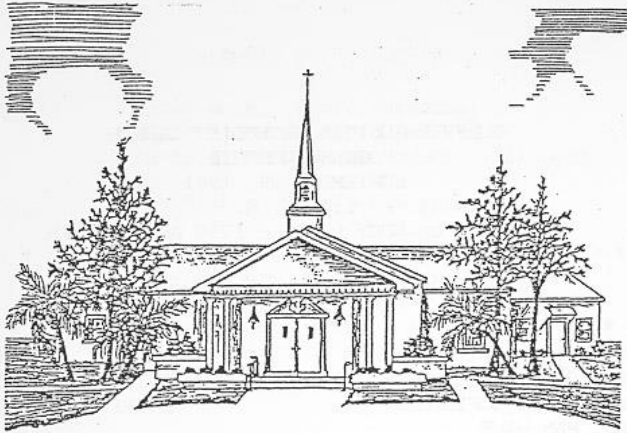

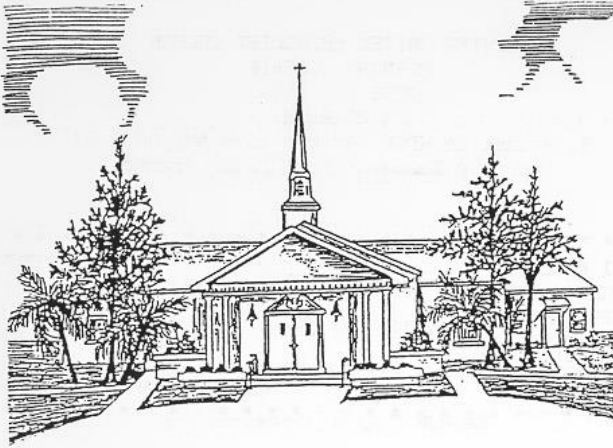
