## Hospital notary totes seal and a smile

Got a will? Need a smile? Or maybe you just want to jump on a trampoline.

Whatever your reason for seeing Barbara Hoyt, division secretary and notary public at Bay Medical Center's business office, chances are her spirit's willing, even if the body's not.

Like-the time her grandsons invited their trim, 53-year-young grandmother to go skateboarding. Already well versed in trampolines and go-carts through them, Hoyt said she had to draw the line.

"I'm afraid my bones are a bit too fragile for that," Hoyt laughs.
But it's Hoyt's outgoing nature which benefits others, including patients and employees at Bay Medical, where she was named the hospital-wide Employee of the Year in 1989.
"If there is a need of any kind, she is always ready to help," said hospital younteer Sandy Sander-

is always ready to help," said hospital volunteer Sandy Sander-son, who helps Hoyt in the business office. "She's just a super person."

#### WHIRLWIND

Born in Newnan, Ga., Hoyt mov-ed to Panama City in 1974. Here she married second husband Harley Hoyt, a navigation training instruc-tor, in 1979 after a "whirlwind romance."

"He's quite the opposite in many ways. He's intelligent, reserved, patient and very, very supportive," Hoyt said. "I share with everybody. It's my nature."

Backed by her husband, Hoyt said she immersed herself in a variety of activities. Now her job has evolved beyond the usual secretarial duties.

In addition to notary work, Hoyt-currently handles most of the office's legal paperwork and comples monthly reports on the status of hospital charity cases. Usually this means working directly with patients.

"I love dealing with the people—

"I that's the best part," said Hoyt, a
self-described "people person."

general, Hoyt say many patients lately are requesting help with "living wills" outlining the signee's final wishes regarding medical care. Requests grew so numerous that she finally drafted a hospital copy based on federal guidelines. Although not tested by a lawyer, people still request it.

"This one is designed with a spiritual nature," Hoyt said, adding: "It's weird, people will call me about it that aren't even in the hospital. They've heard through a friend of a friend."

Working with patients helps her to empathize others, Hoyt said. In fact, her job has helped her cope with the death of her own father, Willard Morris, five years ago. The only girl out of seven children, Hoyt said she had an especially close relationship with her parents.

"I was only three pounds when

born. He (her father) called me his 'miracle baby,'" she said. When Morris was hospitalized with con-gestive heart failure in 1986, she was devastated.

"If I had not been working at the hospital, I'm not sure how easily I'd been able to deal with it," she said. "It sounds strange, but I've learned to see the beauty in it ... Death is a part of God's process."

Now she has three children, Tony, Debbie, Kim and Kellie, and eight grand children. Remaining "children" include two pampered cats, Koko and Kiwi.

Besides her full-time job at the hospital, Hoyt's hobbies include singing at weddings and in her church choir at Gulf View United Methodist Church. She's even made home tapes at the request of friends, taping in her own "music room" at her Hiland Park residence.
