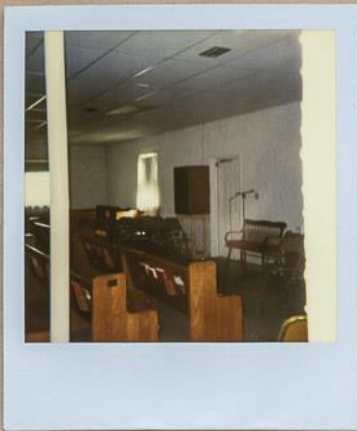

MONTGOMERY, Ala. — Si and Mary Mathison of Panama City and their two sons, John Ed and George, were honored at Huntingdon College recently at the Hall of Honor luncheon during Founder's Day activities celebrating the 138th year of Huntingdon College.

The Mathisons were recognized for establishing the John Ed Mathison and George Mathison Annuity Fund and the Si and Mary Mathison Annuity Fund supporting the college's endowment fund and scholarship programs.

The Mathison family has had a long relationship with Huntingdon College. Si, John Ed and George Mathison are graduates of Huntingdon College, and all three devoted their lives to United Methodist ministry. Si Mathison has served in Alabama pastorates in Loxley, Notasulga, Wetumpka and Opelika. In Florida he was Pensacola District Superintendent and pastor of the First United Methodist Church, Panama City, for 14 years.

For the past 12 years he has been pastor of the Gulfview United Methodist Church, Laguna Beach. He currently is a trustee of Homes for Aging, Alabama-West Florida Methodist Conference and a former member of the Huntingdon College board of trustees. ### Welcome to Alabama-West Florida!

BISHOP and Mrs. William W. Morris have been keeping busy these last few months visiting the churches and districts of the Alabama-West Florida Conference.

The first 600 refugees are to be transported today from camps east inside Thailand across the border to western Cambodia. U.N. officials said the fighting in the north would not affect that repatriation, but added that truce negotiations were another problem facing the general repatriation effort.

Repatriation officials said other problems are the numerous land mines scattered across Cambodia during nearly two decades of strife and the scarcity of safe areas as well as primitive health and living conditions.

"You don't easily take people back to a country after 20 years of bloody conflict," Sergio Vieira de Mello, a special envoy of the U.N. High Commissioner for Refugees, said Sunday at the Thai-Cambodian border.

The Atlantis crew may have accomplished a scientific first — creating double layers of electron charges, a phenomenon previously seen only in the laboratory.

Astronaut Dirk Frimout said that when xenon gas was fired into space, he saw an intense glow like a burning candle atop the gas ejector as well as bright patches in the shape of a cone. Researchers plan to repeat the experiment to verify the results.

Frimout, a Belgian physicist, and the three other scientists aboard Atlantis also spent Sunday photographing the southern lights and airglow, a shimmering

# Mother of five recalls wartime career as jet mechanic

Panama City Beach resident Helen DeLoach was merely the mother of five children in Valdosta, Ga., when World War II broke out. "I had never worked in my life," she said, chucking. "All I did was have babies. When I got married, that's what women were supposed to do. It was normal to get married and have a houseful of children."

Then Moody Air Force Base opened up 12 miles away.

"They were trying to get all the women to come to work there because all the men were overseas," DeLoach said.

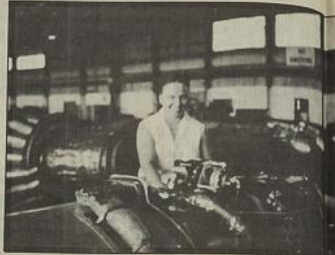
On her mother-in-law Annie Bell DeLoach's suggestion, Helen DeLoach at age 39 took a civil service test and went to work at the base.

"I never will forget that day I went out there with all those women," Helen DeLoach said. "We rode on the bus. I didn't know what was going on or what was going to happen. I was a little nervous because I had never worked."

Of all those women, only four — including DeLoach — made the grade.

At the base, the women were questioned about what jobs they'd held before taking the civil service test. DeLoach had held none, but she told them her husband, J.K. DeLoach who died in 1980, was an auto mechanic.

"I always handed him tools," she said. "They (base personnel)

found out I knew the difference between a screw driver and a pair of pliers and they put me to work in the engine department working on jet engines."

For eight years, including during World War II, Mrs. DeLoach was a jet engine mechanic at Moody Air Force Base.

The only female in engine minor repair, she inspected jet engines and afterburners and disassembled some of them. She assembled major components of the engines and repaired them, pulling up engines and installing them, too.

She also attended special classes to keep up with the changes in technology.

And she enjoyed her job.

"I loved it," she said. "I had a ball. I got along with people and I had a lot of fun. I enjoyed it

because it was really a challenge."

Although, she admitted, "the hardest thing is having babies and having to raise them."

Government cutbacks resulted in several lay-offs of civilian workers, including herself.

"I got rifted so much," she said. "I would have to learn to base and come back when there was an opening. Everything I turned around I was being laid off."

Wary of being laid-off, she left altogether to assist another Valdosta resident in opening a WoolWorth's 10-cent store.

Although she was happy next going to work there as supervisor, the pay was low. DeLoach worked for \$1.05 per hour compared to the \$3,000 annual salary of the jet engine mechanic position.

tion. "I got tired of the Woolworth's job, so I went back out to civilian personnel (at the base)," she said.

She told them, "I know you've got something on this base here I can do."

They put her to work in the commissary stocking groceries.

After 24 years of service at the base — on March 24, 1978 — DeLoach retired.

"My husband wasn't feeling good anyways and we always wanted to travel," she said.

A co-worker, Mary J. Touchton, wrote a poem to her commemorating her nickname "Toots," a name her husband

called her that stayed with her on the job. The poem also commemorated Mrs. DeLoach's "crazy necklaces" and "frisky little self bringing joy to your peers."

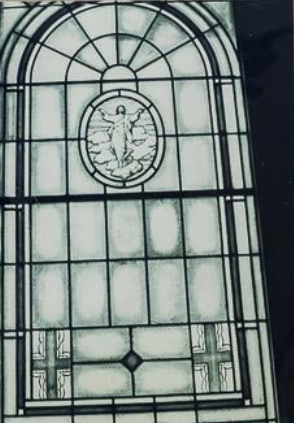
DeLoach moved to the Panama City Beach area from Valdosta about eight years ago. She has five children, 11 grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

# Lawyer grandma raised own kids — and then some

It's been more than 30 years since Rachel Johnson braved the difficulties of raising three daughters alone while attending college, then law school, all while working a full-time job. Her hard work eventually paid off and Johnson became a prominent attorney in Houston, Texas. She still works there, but only part-time, spending most of her time in the Panama City Beach area. And she's still raising children. This time, her grandchildren. But that's not all. Johnson, who is also a great-grandmother, remains quite active in local civic affairs and schools. Also, with her husband Johnny Johnson, she owns and operates the Sea-Vue Motel, 128 Lake Place, Laguna Beach. "I take it just one day at a time," she said. And it's a motto she has lived by since those early days in Texas.

Johnson is a "from back in the woods" of Cut 'n' Shoot, Texas, which is in Montgomery County. She quit school at the age of 17 in 1941 when she married. "I would certainly not recommend (quitting school) to anyone," she said. Ten years later, at the age of 27, she returned to high school to get her diploma. A year after that, she attended the University of Houston to study pre-law. "I always wanted to be a lawyer," she said. "My (then-) first husband was a lawyer and that probably solidified it." But the two separated and divorced that year. Raising the three children alone on a legal secretary's salary and with only \$30 a month her ex-husband paid in child support, Johnson forged on with her education. She achieved her legal degree from the South Texas College of Law in Houston. Johnson became a prominent

attorney, practicing domestic relations law. She has been working only part-time there, however, since 1985. "I have three other lawyers associated with me and they do all the major work," she said. "I just go over for court appearances. I just have the fun part of it." While she was attending col-

lege, Johnson was not only raising her three daughters, she also adopted a child and raised "a throw-away kid," she said. The "throw-away kid" was a school friend of her adopted son and traveled with her family on annual vacations. "One year, when we got back from vacation, his parents had

moved out of the country and left no forwarding address," Johnson said. "We hadn't known this. No one knew they were going to do it. So when we came back from vacation, I put him off in front of his house." A few days later, the boy's neighbor called her to report the parents were gone. "We couldn't find them," Johnson said. So she did the only thing she could think of — take care of him. "I sent him through high school," she said. Johnson met the man who became her husband in 1960 — Johnny Johnson. A Birmingham resident who later adopted her children, Johnny Johnson brought his family to Panama City Beach every year for vacation. "He brought me and the children here and we fell in love with Panama City Beach," Rachel Johnson said. They came every year to the sugar-white beaches and in 1978, purchased the motel. The Johnsons are still raising children Rachel Johnson's grandchildren, who are in the 8th and 9th grades, live with them. She remains very involved in their lives and very involved in the community. Johnson is on the board of directors of the Laguna Beach Property Owners Association, a member of the Gulfview United Methodist Church and is the secretary of the Women's Civic Club on the beach. She also does a lot of volunteer work with West Bay School, bringing art into the classrooms to pique the students' interest in culture. "The kids really do like it," she said. "I don't know if they like it because of the art or if they like it because it interrupts the school day. At least it makes them aware of something else besides just their everyday existence." Not only has she inspired the students, she also apparently inspired members of her family. Her daughter, Liz Hawthorne, practices law in Winterpark and her grandson, Billy Joe Crawford, is studying pre-law at the University of Houston. Both were raised by Johnson after their mother died. Johnson's other daughter, Molly Holiday, teaches students to use computers in Jacksonville. Johnson also has three great-grandchildren, who live in Texas.

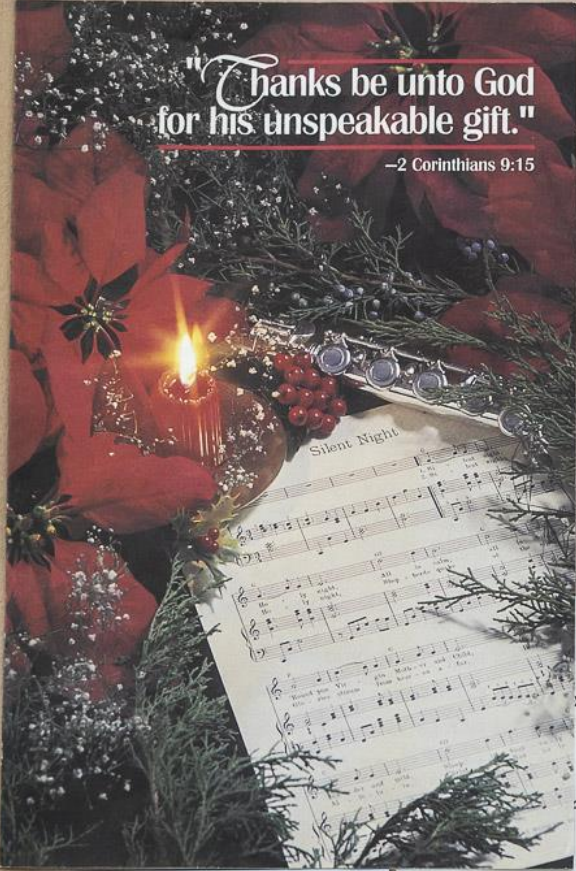

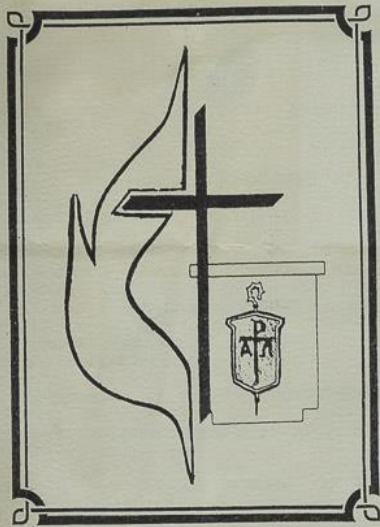

# Middlemas receives Bay Chamber's top honor

During its annual dinner Friday evening, the Bay County Chamber of Commerce recognized Panama City insurance agent John Robert Middlemas for his community service.

The group also honored the Rev. Si Mathison, pastor of Gulfview United Methodist Church on Panama City Beach, for his humanitarian efforts.

Middlemas, a former state representative, accepted the Chamber's Lauren Merriam Memorial Award from Panama City Mayor Gerry Clemons. Middlemas, a Bay County native, is a partner in Black Insurance Agency.

"The main thread is his efforts to preserve the environment," Clemons

told *The News Herald*. He "focused on the environment before it was popular." The annual award is named after the late Merriam, who was a community activist before his death in 1975. It recognizes a successful individual in the private sector who has "devoted time and energy in the community," Clemons said.

His appointments include: the Florida Pollution Control Board, which later became the Florida Department of Environmental Regulation Commission, from 1973 until 1977; the state Postsecondary Education Planning Commission from 1983 until 1986, the last two years as chairman; and, the Florida Board of Regents for the state university system during 1987.

Middlemas has served on the board of directors for Florida First Federal since 1986. He also is chairman of the Bay County Planning Commission and a member of the Bay Medical Center Foundation Board.

The Ray Holloway Humanitarian

award is named for the late general manager of WJHG-TV and active Chamber member whose sense of humor popularized the Chamber's First Friday meetings. The first-time award is not necessarily an annual one; it will be made "as appropriate," said Deck Hull, who made the presentation.

Hull noted that Mathison, 83, moved to the Panama City area 20 years ago and "some people thought he came here to retire."

"But like that little pink rabbit, he keeps going and going and going," he said, noting Mathison's involvement in the Salvation Army, his own church, as chaplain at Bay Medical Center and other efforts. "The guy is so involved, you can't start listing them all."
