Gulfview UMC breaks ground for Mathison Sunday School building

Gulfview United Methodist Church
has served as a beacon of love on Panama City Beach for many years. Under the leadership of Brother Si Mathison, the church welcomed youth groups from throughout the United States and visitors from around the

Two years ago, Brother Si, now pas tor emeritus, retired. The Rev. Jim Fill-ingim then came to pastor and has led the church toward continuing growth both in size and ministry.

The core membership has pulled to-

gether not only to play gracious host to visitors, but also to be family to each other. The only trouble has been, the "little church with the big welcome" has grown too big for its building.

After six months of pledges, projects, planning and prayer, Gulfview met the goal of more than \$260,000 toward the building of the new Mathison Sunday School Annex.

The future two-story building is al-ready named in honor of Brother Si and his late wife Mary.

But, here is the rest of the story.

The church members were deter-mined to have \$260,000 in the building account before breaking ground. About six months ago, pledges were

taken toward the Palm Sunday goal. As the day drew closer, the goal seemed almost unattainable. Faith and perseverance continued when answers seemed few and far between.

Only weeks before goal day, some-one anonymously placed 37 silver dollars on the pulpit after church. It was

for the building fund. Several members mentioned that they would like to buy the silver dollars and Brother Jim jok-ingly asked what would they give for

This led to a suggestion of having a silent auction for the building fund. Within less than two weeks the sale was held on a Friday and Saturday. Donations of coin and stamp collec-

tions, gold and silver jewelry, glass-ware, collectibles, artwork, fishing and golf equipment, household items and even old hunting guns came in. Every item had to have a minimum value of

Sacrifices of long-held treasures were not uncommon and a multitude of blessings were received through heart-

warming stories.

One couple donated their class rings.
The high bidder was thrilled. He and his wife had attended the same school

and had lost their class rings.

The donation of an antique pistol presented a double dilemma, legal and moral. Concerned, a member took the collectible pistol to the police station for advice. An officer made an offer, which was accepted for a donation and the dilemma was placed to rest.

One bidder wanted a computer so

much he ended up bidding against him-self, and held both of the highest bids.

An oil painting was much desired by a church member because it reminded

presumed that they were a donation for the building fund. Several members out-bid by \$25. The top bidder made a \$25 donation to the church and conceded the bid to her.

The Silent Auction brought in more

than \$4,000 for the building fund.
A building lot held another piece to the puzzle God was working on Gulfview's behalf.

Donated almost one year ago, the lot had not sold. Just weeks before, there was finally an offer, a low one. A couple of counter-offers later, the prospective buyer's offer was even

prospective buyer's ofter was even lower than the original ofter.

Then, just 10 days before Palm Sunday, a family saw the lot and knew it was for them. They even pulled the real estate sign up and took it to the sales office. Their initial offer was exactly what the committee had counteroffered previously. Sold!


Offering plates were passed on Palm Sunday morning. The donations were counted in a back room and the slip of paper with the total was brought out at the end of services. The morning offering pushed the building fund over the goal to \$261,987.10.

Fillingim invited everyone outside. He gave the shovel to brother Si who proudly dug in to mark the com-mencement of the much-needed ex-

Fillingim noted that the estimated full amount for the new Sunday School annex is \$400,000.

naturedly started asking what they would give for the coins. This led to the suggestion of





With God smiling down and with God smining down and seeing our need, Brother Jim will hand that shovel to Brother Si this Sunday, and we'll all march out to turn the first shov-


