I ask you, "What do you think God's specific expectations are from you?"


This may be a little harder to list!

Upper Room #1: Tristin and her family have moved on to a three-bedroom house in Springfield and are very appreciative to the Church for helping them get back on their feet!


Voted to accept the drawing concept by David Hansel for the Sanctuary.
