When the Israelites saw the fire coming down from heaven, they fell to their faces to the ground and worshiped God saying: "He is good, His love endures forever."




GUN SAFETY CLASS BY SCOTT FLOWERS

2 sticks butter 2 eggs

1 cup water1 tsp. baking soda3 tbsp. cocoa½ cup buttermilk2 cups flour(1 ½ tbsp. lemon
