Conference Disaffiliation Response

Dear Gulfview Church:

The Alabama-West Florida Conference Board of Trustees has reviewed and denied Gulfview's request to continue in the disaffiliation process.

Gulfview will NOT be allowed to proceed to a vote on disaffiliation. Sadly, this outcome is not unexpected.

At the annual conference in June, the conference rewrote the rules necessary for disaffiliation with the express intent to make it more difficult for churches to remove themselves from the denomination.

Only one church in the conference has been permitted to proceed to a vote. As many as 50 have already been denied continuing the process.

At the start of the disaffiliation process, Alabama West Florida Bishop David Graves repeatedly said that "he wanted churches to be able to get to where they needed to go." That opportunity for Gulfview to go through the discernment process to determine that has been denied.

From the outset, my primary thought process has been that this decision is too big for the future of this church to be taken out of the hands of the congregation. Sadly, that is now the case.

Being in contact with other churches that have been denied the right to vote appear to be following three options: first, seek the church closure paragraph in 2549 that will go into effect in 2024 which is very restrictive, likely to cost more money, and still needs to be approved by the conference trustees; second, litigation, which is costly and time consuming; or third, groups of church members are leaving their churches and starting new congregations in their respective areas.

None of these options appear to be viable for Gulfview.

Churches from two United Methodist conferences in Oklahoma and North Georgia sued the church after their respective conference changed the rules mid-stream in the disaffiliation process. Both won in court. In North

Georgia, 185 churches that were denied the right to vote filed a class action suit and each one was granted the opportunity to vote. But our primary focus, as it has been, is to do God's will.

Our church is made up people with varying beliefs including denominations other than Methodist Church. We love each other. We serve together. We worship together. We help others together. We make disciples together. We lead people to Christ together.

There will be people that are happy with the decision by the conference. There will be people extremely upset. My prayer is that all of us trust God. We serve a mighty God, let God reign. Pray for your church.

God's spirit is here. God's work is being done. There are things out of our control. But serving God with "heart, mind, soul, body, soul, and strength" is not one of them. Don't forget, you control that.
