CHURCH COUNCIL SUMMARY

Here is a summary of our Church Council meeting on July 29; 4 p.m.

- SPR Chair Gayle Mead recommended a bonus for Pastor Brad based on the prior twelve months excess income over expenses and permanently changing the payroll year for pastors from July 1 to June 31 to correspond with the assignment year. Also to catchup lump sum to cover the difference in the last six months of 2023. All passed.
- Finance Chair Jack Kennedy was very pleased to report a positive cash flow over the 2024 Operating Budget for the first six months. A Budget Workshop has been scheduled for Sept. 30 at 4 p.m.
- Membership Chair Sheila Rucks reported membership is steady at 129.
- ◆ Trustee Chair Steve Berkebile mentioned that cabinets are being made for the two TVs at our Pavilion and a new outdoor sound system will be purchased soon. Property insurance has been obtained for the parsonage through Citizens to cover Wind Mitigation as of Aug. 1. Based on the roof inspection, the Trustees recommended a new roof be added to the Budget in 2025. Motion passed to allocate 20% of the monthly income excess over expenses to a "Raise the Roof" Fund and a campaign in 2025 to cover the anticipated cost of \$120,000.
- ◆ Council voted to name Room 203 upstairs the "Si Mathison Room" and convert it from storage to a home for the new Stephen Ministry. This ministry has received a grant from St. Joe Foundation for \$1,300.
- On June 30, the church voted to continue to pursue avenues to leave the United Methodist Church.
 Results: 83.6% yes/16.4% no. On July 29, the Church Council voted to seek litigation for our future options.
