




Mark your calendar for Monday, Aug. 25; 6 p.m. for the monthly UNITED METHODIST MEN men's dinner in the Fellowship Hall.






On Sunday, July 13, we said, "farewell" to Sue Race, who has been here for 25 years. She moved to be closer to family. She will be dearly missed!
