On Friday, the youth dedicated the day to serving at The Ark, where they cleaned the family-room dorms. That evening, they gathered in our pavilion to watch *The Forge*, a movie that encouraged mentoring, faith and service.

Saturday was another day of hands-on ministry. The group assembled Blessing Bags and distributed them to people in need throughout the community. The day concluded with a picnic dinner, karaoke, and a meaningful time of sharing personal testimonies.

The mission trip concluded after Sunday morning worship. During the service, four of the youth shared how the weekend had impacted their faith and perspective. The pastor of Christ Methodist Church, along with a church member who accompanied the group, reflected on the experience and the blessings of serving together.

The weekend was a wonderful reminder that lives are changed not only through acts of service, but also through the relationships built and the opportunity to share God's love with others.

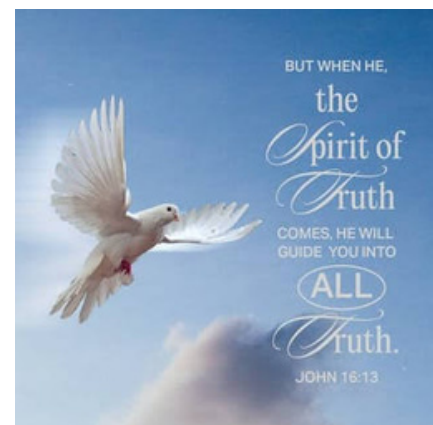
The Holy Spirit
